**Acts 6**

**Please read Acts 6.1-6**

1. How does the issue of imperfect food distribution to widows become a potentially divisive problem for the whole church community?
2. How do the apostles deal with the issue and avert the problem?
3. What criteria is recommended in choosing the new leaders for the food distribution ministry? What can we learn from this for our church ministries?
4. Why was it important that the apostles didn't neglect their own priority when addressing the issue at hand?

*A famous proverb based on the story of the book of Acts goes as follows: "The Lord adds, and sometimes he even multiplies. On occasions he subtracts (Acts 5 Ananias and Saphira), but he never divides – that's the devil's work. **Please read also Proverbs 6.16-19.***

5. What can we learn for ourselves and our own church community from this episode in Acts 6? How can we positively handle issues that will inevitably arise in a culturally diverse and imperfect church community?
