- 2. What is it that knocks Paul and Barnabas down in these verses? And what enables them to get back up again?
- 3. How could this approach help you to overcome opposition as you follow God in living out your faith and ministry?

- 4. As the word of the Lord spreads, the opposition grows. To every spiritual action there is an 'equal' and opposite spiritual reaction. What do you notice about the changing nature of the opposition against Paul and Barnabas?

- 6. How could this approach help you to overcome opposition in your journey of faith?
