The Holy Spirit comes to continue Jesus' Work – to save people from all nations from their sins and for a new relationship with God - and to renew all things in the love and power of God. At Pentecost, there is a particular aspect of the work of the Holy Spirit in view - He has come to enable Jesus' followers to partner with God in witnessing and working for the Kingdom of God, now come on earth as it is in heaven.
