

1. How would you define sin? (Romans 3:23 may help)

Please read Romans 1:28-32

This paints a harrowing picture of depravity and it is easy to imagine it is addressed to other people not us.

- 2. Now read the passage again, can you honestly say you are guilty of none of the sins listed here?
- 3. Imagine for a moment that Jesus had not sacrificed himself for our sins and we were held accountable for the things we have done, or left undone. What would this mean in terms of:
 - a. Eternity?
 - b. Life here and now?
- 4. Although many people come to God out of fear of His wrath and punishment, most come to Him because of His great love. Take time to consider what it means to be loved by God.

Please read Romans 3:24-25

5. Having thought about what it would be like if we were held accountable for our own sin, what does v24 mean to you? What about V.25?
