## Questions on our church value of being Prophetic:

Eph 4: 11-12 says 'Christ himself gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the pastors and teachers, <sup>12</sup> to equip his people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up'

- Which of these ministry giftings do you already see in the people in your group and the wider church family?

## Does this description of a prophet line up with your understanding of Biblical prophets?

- Know God's will.
- Particularly attuned to God and his truth for today.
- Listening.
- Bring correction and challenge the dominant assumptions we inherit from the culture.
- Insist that the community obey what God has commanded.
- Question the status quo.

What does it look like today, in our church, to speak and act prophetically, while 'speaking the truth in love' (Eph 4:15)?

If you believe God is wanting to speak through you, how do you respond? Are there similarities with the prophetic callings of Jeremiah (Ch 1) and Isaiah (Ch 6)?

- How do you discern if it is God speaking to and through you and how would you test it, after a prophetic word is spoken?

## Do you have experience of God speaking prophetically through or to you?

- Was it something that 'encouraged and blessed' you or others?
- If it wasn't an 'encouragement or blessing', how does it make you feel about engaging in the prophetic again?

## Questions about our 6 Church Values:

As we wrestle with our 6 church values (Sacrificial, Worshipping, Missionary/Missional and Prophetic – with Holy and Inclusive still to come), take the opportunity in the next few weeks, to start to collectively ask ourselves...

- 1. Is this who we are?
- 2. Do we 'own' these values as a church and live them out well?
- 3. Are there any values that are obviously missing?
- 4. Could we summarise our values in a sentence or reduce them down to 3 other words?
